



HOMESTEAD RANCH OUTFITTERS HUNTING GEAR LIST

(Rifle)

- One reliable rifle and 20 rounds of ammunition for big game. (Practice shooting out to 400 yards)
- Duffel bag or heavy canvas gear bag for all your gear except your sleeping bag.
- Hunter orange vest made of quiet material, minimum of 400 square inches.
- Insulated, waterproof, high top hiking boots. (Make sure to have them broken in before arriving)
- Shell layer pants and light jacket. Wool shirt and pants are also a good option.
- Rain gear top and bottom or other wind and water barrier.
- Base layer top and bottom. It is a good idea to bring a light and heavy base layer set.
- Moisture wicking socks both wool and regular.
- Extra shirts and under shirts for layering are important.
- Warm winter coat.
- Cold weather hat, beanie, or headgear.
- Two pairs of gloves and/or mittens.
- Sleeping bag. (Medium weight to be used in the cabin)
- Water bottle (water bladders can be used alongside a bottle).
- 2 disposable lighters and fire starter.
- 2 small flashlights or headlamps with extra batteries.
- Sharp skinning knife, compass, binoculars, watch.
- A daypack or small hunting backpack large enough to carry daily necessities.
- Personal items. (Toothbrush, prescriptions, extra glasses/contacts, first aid items, etc.)
- (Optional) GPS or hunt app on phone. Make sure to have maps of the area purchased or downloaded before arriving.
- (Optional) Slippers or light weight shoes for the cabin.
- (Optional) Camera.

This list is not all inclusive. You may have some other items that you use for hunting but if you are not sure that you will need it, it is best not to bring it.

(Archery)

- One reliable bow, arrows, and mechanical release. We recommend no less than 50 lb draw weight and require fixed blade broad heads. (Practice shooting out to 75 yards)
- Duffel bag or heavy canvas gear bag for all your gear except your sleeping bag.
- Camouflage clothing or outer layer.
- Insulated, waterproof, high top hiking boots. (Make sure to have them broken in before arriving)
- Shell layer pants and light jacket. Wool shirt and pants are also a good option.
- Rain gear top and bottom or other wind and water barrier.
- Base layer top and bottom. It is a good idea to bring a light and heavy base layer set.
- Moisture wicking socks both wool and regular.
- Extra shirts and under shirts for layering are important.
- Warm winter coat or puffy jacket.
- One pair of light gloves.
- Camo hat.
- Sleeping bag. (Medium weight to be used in the cabin)
- Water bottle (water bladders can be used alongside a bottle).
- 2 disposable lighters and fire starter.
- 2 small flashlights or headlamps with extra batteries.
- Sharp skinning knife, compass, binoculars, watch.
- A daypack or small hunting backpack large enough to carry daily necessities.
- Personal items. (Toothbrush, prescriptions, extra glasses/contacts, first aid items, etc.)
- (Optional) GPS or hunt app on phone. Make sure to have maps of the area purchased or downloaded before arriving.
